Catalog Course Description: To build upon the fundamentals of gathering, organizing, evaluating and writing objective reports/broadcasts, and to provide students with an understanding of what a career in the age of digital journalism entails.

- 8. Demonstrate an advanced awareness of legal and ethical issues affecting news-gathering and reporting;

- 10. Demonstrate a sensitivity in coverage of diverse cultures and populations
- 11. Plan next-issue editorial content and packaging
