CDEV 242: PRESCHOOL DEVELOPMENT

Explores the social-emotional, cognitive, and physical development of children from 3 to 6 years. Examines models and international perspectives. Apply knowledge of preschoolers to curricular choices. Discuss home, school, and community connections.
