CDEV 304: TEACHING MATH TO YOUNG CHILDREN

Catalog Course Description:

Study of interactions, which set the stage for math talks and problem-solving skills. Examine and evaluate use of materials, problem solving techniques, and enriching conversations that will foster mathematic processes.

Prerequisites: Admission to BAS Child Development

Corequisites: 10 hours of field experience must be completed to successful complete the course.

- 1. Students will create a lesson plan that uses a variety of strategies for math instruction in the early childhood classroom. (NAEYC Standards 1a, b, c; 4a, b, c, d) (WV Core Competencies 1.6, 1.7)

CLO Assessment Methods: Written assignments, discussions, online assignments and projects.

Topics to be studied:

- Research results related to mathematics and young children.
- Guidance and mathematical interactions with young children birth to 5 years.
- Exploration of manipulatives, materials, and uses within the mathematics field.
- Integrating mathematics throughout the daily routine.
- Literature connections to mathematics field.
